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1 INTRODUCTION

As a Sacred Heart school, we are committed to creating a community where every person is known, loved and valued. Inspired by St Madeleine Sophie Barat and the charism of the Society of the Sacred Heart, prayer and liturgy are at the heart of school life, nurturing a deep relationship with God and encouraging all members of our community to respond generously to the needs of others.

Through prayer, worship and reflection, we seek to:

- Deepen our relationship with Jesus Christ.
- Foster a spirit of faith, hope and love.
- Encourage personal and communal reflection.
- Promote justice, compassion and service.
- Celebrate the dignity and uniqueness of every person.
- Build a community rooted in Gospel values.

‘The celebration of Catholic liturgies and prayers as an integral part of the learning and teaching should enable the school community to become reflective, experience the presence of God and should develop a mature spiritual life.’ (Marcus Stock (2012), *Christ at the Centre*, Catholic Truth Society, 23.)

2 SACRED HEART ETHOS

The Five Goals of Sacred Heart Education

Prayer and liturgy are also shaped by the Five Goals of Sacred Heart Education, which provide the framework for the spiritual and educational mission of the Society of the Sacred Heart. These Goals shape how we pray, worship, reflect and live together as a faith community.

2.1 Goal One: A Personal and Active Faith in God

Prayer and liturgy nurture a living relationship with God through scripture, sacramental life, reflection and service. Students are encouraged to deepen their understanding of God's love revealed in the Sacred Heart of Jesus and to respond to that love through faith-filled action.

2.2 Goal Two: A Deep Respect for Intellectual Values

Liturgy and prayer invite students to engage thoughtfully with Scripture, Catholic teaching and the questions of contemporary life. Reflection, dialogue and discernment are encouraged so that faith and reason work together in the pursuit of truth.

2.3 Goal Three: A Social Awareness Which Impels to Action

Prayer leads to action. Through liturgies, reflections and communal prayer, students are challenged to respond to issues of justice, peace, human dignity and care for creation. The school community is encouraged to put faith into practice through service and advocacy.

2.4 Goal Four: The Building of Community as a Christian Value

Prayer and worship strengthen relationships and foster a spirit of belonging. Our liturgical life promotes welcome, inclusion, reconciliation and mutual respect, reflecting the belief that every person is created and loved by God.

2.5 Goal Five: Personal Growth in an Atmosphere of Wise Freedom

Prayer creates opportunities for self-reflection, discernment and spiritual growth. Students are encouraged to develop confidence, responsibility and integrity, learning to make choices guided by Gospel values and an informed conscience.

3 AIMS OF THE PRAYER AND LITURGY PROVISION

In keeping with the charism of the Sacred Heart, prayer and liturgy within the school will seek to:

1. Foster a spirit of contemplation and reflection and a deep relationship with the person of Jesus Christ.
2. Encourage awareness of God's presence in everyday life.
3. Promote gratitude, generosity and compassion.
4. Develop habits of discernment and thoughtful decision-making.
5. Inspire service to others, especially those most in need.
6. Celebrate the dignity, giftedness and uniqueness of every individual.
7. Create opportunities for silence and personal encounter with God.
8. Strengthen commitment to justice, peace and the common good.
9. Personal growth in an atmosphere of wise freedom

The Prayer and Liturgy programme will also:

- Enable students to experience a variety of prayer styles and traditions.
- Support the spiritual development of all students and staff.
- Encourage participation in liturgical celebrations.
- Develop students' confidence in planning and leading prayer.
- Foster reflection on the presence of God in daily life.
- Promote understanding of the liturgical year and the traditions of the Catholic Church.
- Encourage respect for those of different faith traditions while remaining rooted in Catholic identity.
- Inspire commitment to justice, peace and care for creation.

4 PRINCIPLES

Prayer and liturgy in the school will:

- Be inclusive, respectful and accessible.
- Reflect the liturgical life of the Church.
- Be age-appropriate and relevant to students' experiences.
- Encourage active participation.

- Provide opportunities for silence, contemplation and reflection.
- Celebrate cultural diversity and the universal nature of the Church.
- Be inspired by Sacred Heart traditions of reflection, discernment and service.

5 THE KAIROS CENTRE

The Kairos Centre is the spiritual heart of the school and serves as the central hub for chaplaincy, prayer, pastoral support and faith formation. Inspired by the Sacred Heart tradition of encounter, reflection and discernment, the Kairos Centre provides a welcoming space where students, staff and visitors can deepen their relationship with God and one another.

5.1 Aims

The Kairos Centre aims to:

- Provide a dedicated space for prayer, reflection and worship.
- Support the spiritual, emotional and pastoral wellbeing of students and staff.
- Promote the Sacred Heart Goals and values throughout the school.
- Encourage participation in liturgy, retreats, social justice initiatives and faith formation programmes.
- Foster a culture of belonging, welcome and inclusion.
- Serve as a place of accompaniment where students can explore questions of faith, vocation and purpose.
- Coordinate chaplaincy activities and outreach within the school and wider community.

The Kairos Centre will be accessible throughout the school day and will provide opportunities for individual prayer, group reflection, liturgical celebrations and pastoral support.

5.2 Kairos Student Representatives

In keeping with the Sacred Heart commitment to leadership, wise freedom and community, each tutor group will nominate or elect Kairos Student Representatives who will support the spiritual life of the school.

Kairos Representatives will act as ambassadors and help strengthen the culture of prayer and reflection across the school community.

Their responsibilities may include:

- Leading and supporting tutor group prayer and reflection.
- Assisting in the preparation and delivery of liturgies and school Masses.
- Promoting the liturgical seasons and key Sacred Heart feast days.
- Encouraging student participation in chaplaincy activities.
- Supporting charity, justice and outreach initiatives linked to Goal Three: A Social Awareness Which Impels to Action.
- Representing the views and ideas of students regarding prayer, liturgy and faith formation.

- Assisting with displays, prayer spaces and resources within tutor areas and communal spaces.
- Supporting events organised through the Kairos Centre.
- Modelling the values of respect, service, compassion and inclusion.

5.3 Leadership of Kairos Representatives

The Kairos Representatives will be coordinated by the Chaplaincy Team and supported by Heads of Year and Tutors.

They will:

- Receive training and formation appropriate to their role.
- Meet regularly to contribute to the development of the school's prayer and liturgy programme.
- Participate in Sacred Heart Goal reviews and chaplaincy evaluations where appropriate.
- Act as role models who embody the school mission and the charism of the Society of the Sacred Heart.

Through the work of the Kairos Centre and the leadership of the Kairos Student Representatives, students are empowered to become active participants in the school's faith life, living out the Sacred Heart call to know and share God's love, build community,

5.4 Kairos Student Leadership Projects

Kairos Representatives may undertake specific projects that contribute to the spiritual life of the school, including:

- Creating prayer resources for tutor groups.
- Developing seasonal prayer spaces and displays.
- Producing student-led reflections and newsletters.
- Organising awareness campaigns linked to Catholic Social Teaching.
- Leading charity events.
- Planning Sacred Heart Feast Day celebrations.
- Supporting new students through welcome initiatives.
- Gathering student voice on prayer and liturgy.
- Promoting the Five Goals of Sacred Heart Education across the school.

Through these activities, the Kairos Centre serves as a living expression of the Society of the Sacred Heart's mission, enabling students to grow in faith, deepen their sense of community, develop leadership skills and become agents of hope, justice and compassion in the world.

5.5 Examples of Kairos Centre Activities

The Kairos Centre coordinates a wide range of activities that support the spiritual development of students and promote the Sacred Heart Goals. These activities provide opportunities for prayer, leadership, service, community building and action for justice.

5.6 Remembrance and Reflection

In recognition of Goal Four, The Building of Community as a Christian Value, the Kairos Centre plays a key role in helping the community remember, reflect and support one another.

Examples include:

- Remembrance Day Services.
- Acts of remembrance for those who have died.
- Memorial prayer spaces.
- Reflection following significant local, national or global events.
- Prayer services following bereavement within the school community.
- Reflection activities during Mental Health Awareness events.
- Candle lighting and remembrance displays.

5.7 Assemblies

Kairos Representatives and the Chaplaincy Team may contribute to assemblies throughout the school year, including:

- Mission and Values Assemblies.
- Sacred Heart Goal Assemblies.
- Liturgical Season Assemblies.
- Social Justice and Catholic Social Teaching themes.
- Feast Day Celebrations.
- Equality, Diversity and Inclusion themes.
- Environmental Stewardship and Care for Creation.
- Vocations and Personal Growth.
- Charity and Service Initiatives.

5.8 Fundraising and Social Action

In line with Goal Three, A Social Awareness Which Impels to Action, the Kairos Centre encourages students to put faith into action through service and fundraising initiatives.

Examples include:

- Sacred Heart network fundraising projects.
- CAFOD campaigns and appeals.
- Local foodbank collections.
- Advent and Lenten charitable appeals.
- Christmas hamper projects.
- Fairtrade campaigns.
- Care for Creation initiatives.
- Community volunteering opportunities.
- International Sacred Heart solidarity projects.

- Emergency appeals in response to humanitarian crises.

Kairos Representatives may help organise, promote and evaluate these initiatives.

5.9 Retreats and Spiritual Development

The Kairos Centre will encourage opportunities for deeper reflection and faith formation through:

- Year group retreat days.
- Sacred Heart Goal reflection days.
- Student leadership retreats.
- Staff retreats and reflection opportunities.
- Pilgrimages and visits to places of significance.
- Prayer workshops.
- Chaplaincy training programmes.
- Discernment and vocation activities.

and will seek justice and foster student growth in wise freedom.

6 ANNUAL PLAN OF PROVISION (APOP)

6.1 Purpose and Context

Prayer and liturgy at Sacred Heart are guided by an Annual Plan of Provision (APOP), coordinated by the Chaplaincy Team through the Kairos Centre and reviewed annually by senior leaders and governors. The APOP ensures that all students experience a rich programme of prayer, worship, liturgical celebration, faith formation and opportunities for service throughout the academic year.

The APOP is informed by:

- The liturgical year of the Catholic Church.
- The mission and charism of the Society of the Sacred Heart.
- The Five Goals of Sacred Heart Education.
- Diocesan guidance.
- The pastoral and spiritual needs of the school community.
- Student voice and feedback from Kairos Representatives.

The APOP will identify key opportunities for prayer, worship, liturgical celebrations, retreats, social action projects and sacramental experiences across the academic year.

6.2 Liturgical Events

The school's annual programme will include opportunities for students and staff to participate in liturgical events that mark the rhythm of the Church's year and the distinct traditions of Sacred Heart education.

These may include:

Autumn Term

- Welcome Mass for Year 7 and new staff
- Remembrance Services
- Advent Assemblies and Liturgies
- Carol Services and Christmas Celebrations
- Reconciliation Services during Advent

Spring Term

- Epiphany Celebrations
- Holocaust Memorial Day Reflection
- Ash Wednesday Services
- Lent Liturgies
- Stations of the Cross
- CAFOD Family Fast Day Initiatives
- Reconciliation Services during Lent

Summer Term

- Easter Liturgies
- Feast of St Madeleine Sophie Barat (25 May celebrated where appropriate in the school calendar)
- Feast of the Sacred Heart
- Pentecost Celebrations
- Year Group and Whole School Masses
- Leavers' Liturgies
- Commissioning and Leadership Celebrations

Access to the Sacraments

As a Catholic Sacred Heart school, we recognise the importance of the sacraments as privileged encounters with God's grace and love.

The school will seek to provide regular opportunities for students and staff to access the sacramental life of the Church through:

Eucharist

- Whole school Masses.
- Year group Masses.
- Form Masses and special celebrations.
- Feast day celebrations.
- Voluntary opportunities to participate in Mass where appropriate.

Sacrament of Reconciliation

- Advent and Lent reconciliation services.
- Opportunities for individual confession in collaboration with local clergy.

- Preparation and guidance to support students in understanding the sacrament.

Celebration of Sacred Heart Feast Days

The celebration of Sacred Heart feast days is a distinctive feature of the school's liturgical life and provides opportunities for the whole community to deepen its understanding of the Society of the Sacred Heart's mission.

Particular emphasis will be given to:

Feast of the Sacred Heart

As the principal feast of the Society of the Sacred Heart, this celebration provides an opportunity to:

- Reflect on God's unconditional love for humanity.
- Renew commitment to the school mission.
- Celebrate the Sacred Heart Goals.
- Participate in Mass, prayer services and community activities.
- Engage in acts of service and charity inspired by Gospel values.

Network and International Sacred Heart Celebrations

The school will participate in opportunities to celebrate and strengthen links with the wider Sacred Heart family, including:

- Sacred Heart Network initiatives.
- International Sacred Heart events.
- Goal-focused celebrations.
- Collaborative projects with other Sacred Heart schools.
- Prayer for the global Sacred Heart community.

6.3 Retreat Programme

In keeping with the Sacred Heart tradition of reflection, discernment and personal growth, all students will participate in a progressive retreat programme throughout their time at the school. Retreats provide dedicated opportunities away from the demands of daily school life for students to deepen their relationship with God, reflect on their personal development, build community and explore the values of the Gospel.

6.4 Daily Prayer

All members of the school community participate in daily prayer opportunities.

These may include:

- Morning prayer in tutor groups.
- Reflection at the beginning or end of lessons.
- Prayer linked to current events, school concerns and global issues.
- Sacred Heart prayers and traditions, including prayers associated with St Madeleine Sophie Barat and St Philippine Duchesne.

Students will be encouraged to prepare and lead prayer regularly.

Weekly and Seasonal Prayer

Throughout the school year, opportunities will be provided for:

- Year group liturgies.
- House or community prayer gatherings.
- Reconciliation services.
- Adoration and contemplative prayer.
- Prayer linked to significant Church feasts and seasons.
- Reflection days and retreats.

Special attention will be given to:

- Advent
- Christmas
- Lent
- Holy Week and Easter
- Pentecost
- Feast of the Sacred Heart

7 SACRED SPACES

The school will provide appropriate spaces that promote prayer and reflection, including:

- A chapel or designated prayer space.
- Areas for quiet reflection.
- Visual displays reflecting the liturgical season and Sacred Heart heritage.

These spaces will be welcoming, reverent and regularly maintained.

8 INCLUSION AND DIVERSITY

As a Catholic Sacred Heart community, we welcome people of all faiths and none.

- Respect the beliefs and backgrounds of all members of the community.
- Encourage dialogue and mutual understanding.
- Remain faithful to the Catholic tradition and Sacred Heart charism.
- Recognise the richness brought by cultural and religious diversity.

9 ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

9.1 Governors

Governors will:

- Ensure that prayer and liturgy remain central to the life and mission of the school.
- Promote and protect the Catholic and Sacred Heart character of the school.
- Monitor the implementation and impact of this policy.
- Support the provision of resources, facilities and staff development for prayer and liturgy.

- Receive reports on the quality and effectiveness of collective worship and spiritual life.
- Encourage opportunities for prayer, reflection and faith formation for all members of the school community.
- Ensure that prayer and liturgy contribute to the achievement of the Five Goals of Sacred Heart Education.

9.2 The Chaplaincy Team

The Chaplaincy Team will:

- Prayer and liturgy are central to the Catholic life of the school and therefore are in line with the guidance set out by the Prayer and Liturgy Directory
- There is an Annual Plan of Provision for prayer and liturgy across the school year which identifies liturgical seasons and key celebrations, as well as opportunities for the celebration of the Sacraments (APOP, see Annex 1)
- There is daily planned prayer for all pupils, appropriate to age and ability, as outlined in the Prayer and Liturgy Directory
- Pupils are supported in their liturgical formation to take an active role in the planning, preparation, and delivery of prayer and liturgy according to their age and capacity, and in a manner which facilitates their progressive participation
- Resources to support the planning of prayer and liturgy are appropriate and readily available to staff and pupils
- Induction on prayer and liturgy takes place for new members of staff as required
- Staff have access to effective training and formation opportunities
- Monitoring and evaluation of prayer and liturgy take place regularly and feed back into planning for future liturgies
- Monitoring of prayer and liturgy is reported to the head teacher

There is collaboration with local clergy and parishes

9.3 Heads of Year

Heads of Year play a key role in fostering the spiritual development of students within their year groups.

They will:

- Ensure that prayer and liturgy form an integral part of year group activities.
- Support tutors in leading meaningful acts of prayer and reflection.
- Coordinate year group liturgies, assemblies and celebrations.
- Encourage student participation and leadership in prayer.
- Promote the values of the Sacred Heart Goals within daily interactions and pastoral work.
- Support students during significant moments of celebration, loss, challenge or transition.

- Work closely with the Chaplaincy Team to provide appropriate spiritual opportunities for students.

9.4 All Staff

All staff contribute to the spiritual ethos of the school by:

- Modelling Gospel values and Sacred Heart principles.
- Supporting and participating in prayer and liturgy.
- Encouraging reflection, respect and reverence.
- Helping students recognise God's presence in everyday life.
- Promoting the Five Goals of Sacred Heart Education through their teaching, relationships and professional conduct.

9.5 Students

Students are active participants in the prayer and liturgical life of the school.

Students will be encouraged to:

- Participate respectfully in prayer and liturgy.
- Lead and prepare acts of worship.
- Serve as chaplaincy and liturgy leaders.
- Contribute prayers, readings, music and reflections.
- Demonstrate the Sacred Heart Goals through service, leadership and action for justice.
- Support the creation of a welcoming and inclusive faith community.

10 MONITORING AND EVALUATION

The effectiveness of this policy will be reviewed through:

- Student voice and feedback.
- Staff consultation.
- Chaplaincy review.
- Observation of prayer and liturgy.
- Evaluation following major liturgical celebrations.
- Review against the mission and goals of Sacred Heart education.

11 TRAINING AND FORMATION

All new staff will be supported during induction and beyond, so that they fully understand the responsibility they carry within their individual role for leading prayer and liturgy in the school. Any individual training needs will be identified and addressed through training and formation. There will also be the opportunity for whole-staff professional development at least once a year, so that all staff understand the importance of prayer and liturgy and relevant staff are well supported to lead as required.

12 EVALUATING PRAYER AND LITURGY

The effectiveness of the Prayer and Liturgy programme will be reviewed by considering:

- How prayer supports students' personal faith development.
- The opportunities provided for reflection and intellectual engagement with faith.
- The extent to which worship inspires action for justice and service.
- The contribution of prayer and liturgy to community building.
- Evidence of personal growth, leadership and responsible freedom among students.

12.1 Evaluation of the Quality of Prayer and Liturgy Provision

As a Sacred Heart school, we are committed to ensuring that prayer and liturgy are meaningful, inclusive, spiritually enriching and rooted in the charism of the Society of the Sacred Heart. The quality of provision will be regularly evaluated to ensure it supports the spiritual development of all members of the school community and reflects the Five Goals of Sacred Heart Education.

Evaluation will focus on:

- The extent to which prayer and liturgy promote a personal and active faith in God.
- Student participation and engagement in prayer, worship and liturgical celebrations.
- The quality and variety of prayer experiences provided.
- Opportunities for leadership through the Kairos Centre and Kairos Representatives.
- The visibility and impact of the Sacred Heart Goals across the school.
- Access to the sacraments and opportunities for spiritual development.
- The contribution of prayer and liturgy to community building and pastoral care.
- The impact of social action, fundraising and service activities inspired by prayer and reflection.
- The quality and effectiveness of the Annual Plan of Provision (APOP).
- The contribution of prayer and liturgy to the overall Catholic Life and Mission of the school.

Methods of Evaluation

The school will use a range of methods to evaluate the effectiveness of prayer and liturgy, including:

- Student voice surveys and focus groups.
- Feedback from Kairos Representatives.
- Staff evaluations and reflections.
- Observation of tutor group prayer, assemblies and liturgical celebrations.
- Chaplaincy Team reviews.

- Feedback from clergy and visitors involved in liturgical celebrations.
- Governor monitoring visits.
- Participation data from chaplaincy activities, retreats and sacramental opportunities.
- Review of the Annual Plan of Provision.
- Self-evaluation against diocesan, national and Sacred Heart expectations.

Role of Kairos Representatives in Evaluation

Kairos Representatives play a vital role in evaluating and improving the school's prayer and liturgy provision. Through regular meetings with the Chaplaincy Team, they will:

- Gather feedback from tutor groups.
- Suggest new initiatives and improvements.
- Evaluate key liturgical events and chaplaincy activities.
- Help ensure that student voice informs future planning.
- Contribute to the annual review of the Prayer and Worship Calendar and APOP.

13 REPORTING AND REVIEW

Termly reports will be prepared by the Chaplain and these will be shared with Senior Leaders and Governors. The report will identify:

- Updates on activities and events
- Areas for continued development
- Progress against strategic objectives.

This process of reflection and evaluation mirrors the Sacred Heart tradition of discernment, ensuring that prayer and liturgy continually respond to the needs of the community while remaining faithful to the mission of St Madeleine Sophie Barat and the Five Goals of Sacred Heart Education.

13.1 Success Criteria

Prayer and liturgy provision will be considered effective when there is evidence that:

- Students actively participate in and lead prayer and worship.
- The Sacred Heart Goals are visible and understood throughout the school.
- Students demonstrate growing confidence in faith, leadership and service.
- Prayer inspires action for justice, compassion and the common good.
- The Kairos Centre is recognised as the hub of the school's spiritual life.
- Staff and students feel supported in their spiritual development.
- The Catholic and Sacred Heart identity of the school is evident in everyday life.
- Prayer and liturgy contribute positively to the formation of young people who are faith-filled, reflective, compassionate and committed to transforming the world in the spirit of the Sacred Heart.

This commitment to ongoing evaluation ensures that prayer and liturgy remain vibrant, relevant and central to the mission of the school.

14 RATIFICATION

This Policy has been approved and ratified by the Headteacher and Governing Body in September 2026. The Policy will be reviewed every two years.
